

Repentance: Sins of Speech

Matthew 12:36-37 But I say unto you, That every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment. For by your words you shall be justified, and by your words you shall be condemned.

Below are some questions that can help us all go deeper with God during our quiet time this week

- How do I currently use my words? Would other Christians say that I use my words in a godly manner? Or would they say the opposite?
- What does my current use of language say about my Faith in Jesus?
- Do I see a connection between the words I use on a daily basis and how I feel God's power in my life? If yes, how?
- In the sermon, several different specific areas of "sins of speech" were addressed (Complaining, Gossip, Speaking Truth in Love). Which of these does God want me to work on in this season of my life?
- For parents: Are the words I use with my children speak forth love and care for them? What would they say if I asked them?
