Lies that prevent us from being healed

Luke 15:20 ...But when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him.

Today's sermon is a follow-up to several previous sermons. Please check out those sermons again if you would like to go deeper on today's topic:

- Have I ever fully experienced God's forgiveness and restoration like the younger brother in Luke 15:20 and 22-24.
- Does my life reflect that I'm fully forgiven and restored by God? How? If not, why not?
- Do I deal regularly with anger, bitterness, exhaustion and „feeling treated unfairly“? What is the cause for all of this? Can I find some aspect of the „older brother“ in me that causes all this?
- What is my understanding of „repentance“? Is it in line with the Biblical definition? Do I practice Biblical repentance on a regular basis?
- What does God want me to do to be experience His full restoration?
