The Spirit vs. Works

2 Corinthians 3:17 Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty.

Below are some questions that can help us all go deeper with God during our quiet time this week

- When I read the book of Galatians (esp. Chapter 3): Where can I see myself in the Galatians? How do Paul's words speak and apply to me and my life?
- Do I sometimes compare myself with other people and consider myself a „better person“? Do I sometimes believe that „I deserve better than others, because of my performance“?
- Do I sometimes try to „earn“ something from God? Do I believe that I „deserve something good“ from God, because of what I've done for Him?
- What underlying need is not being met that causes me to try to „earn something from God“?
- What practical steps can I take to let go of my reliance on my works?
